


Fact Sheet for HUNGARY

Our core services in Refugee and Migrants' Aid	 present at the Hungarian transit zones along the border of Hungary and Serbia 2 times a week, collaborating with other NGOs distributing food, drink, hot tea, clothing, blankets and hygiene kits to migrants with a special focus on the most vulnerable groups of women and children at Szabadka refugee camp weekly from Friday thru Sunday organizing various youth workshops, special learning and integration programs supplemental support in health care at unique locations such as the Children's home at Fót working on a case-by-case basis with families of individual status our labor market integration project called "Jobs for You" serves job seeking third country nationals 8 hours a day from Monday to Thursday
Our expertise in Refugee and Migrants' Aid	 our most important added value is the direct first-hand information as Hungary is the first member state where migrants first enter the EU in the West Balkans as needed 24 hour service along Hungarys southern border and the at the exit points towards Austria medical aid - through our mobile clinics we offer regular screenings and access to health care our doctors and nurses make regularly scheduled visits even to the remote areas frequented by migrant groups psycho-social support service available at the Reception Centers
National challenges and solutions created with the Order of Malta	 National challenges in the field of migration: securing material continuity Your local contribution: see the previous entry (our expertise) created a migration and refugee management panel which is responsible for strategic planning and providing technical expertise
Best practice	 cooperation agreement with the Serbian government - as a result we can legally work along both sides of the border of Hungary and Serbia providing complementary, gapfilling services. We're the only Hungarian organization able to legally offer its charitable services to migrants on Serbian territory a new cooperation agreement with the Malteser organization in Slovenia also underway is a plan to collaborate with the Serbian Red Cross concentrating the support on the areas along the border referred to as no man's land
