<p><b>Our core services in Refugee and Migrants' Aid</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- present at the Hungarian transit zones along the border of Hungary and Serbia 2 times a week, collaborating with other NGOs distributing food, drink, hot tea, clothing, blankets and hygiene kits to migrants with a special focus on the most vulnerable groups of women and children</li> <li>- at Szabadka refugee camp weekly from Friday thru Sunday organizing various youth workshops, special learning and integration programs</li> <li>- supplemental support in health care at unique locations such as the Children's home at Fót</li> <li>- working on a case-by-case basis with families of individual status</li> <li>- our labor market integration project called "Jobs for You" serves job seeking third country nationals 8 hours a day from Monday to Thursday</li> </ul>
<p><b>Our expertise in Refugee and Migrants' Aid</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- our most important added value is the direct first-hand information as Hungary is the first member state where migrants first enter the EU in the West Balkans</li> <li>- as needed 24 hour service along Hungary's southern border and the at the exit points towards Austria</li> <li>- medical aid - through our <b>mobile clinics</b> we offer regular screenings and access to health care</li> <li>- our doctors and nurses make regularly scheduled visits even to the remote areas frequented by migrant groups</li> <li>- psycho-social support service available at the Reception Centers</li> </ul>

<p><b>Best practice</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- cooperation agreement with the Serbian government - as a result we can legally work along both sides of the border of Hungary and Serbia providing complementary, gap-filling services. We're the only Hungarian organization able to legally offer its charitable services to migrants on Serbian territory</li> <li>- a new cooperation agreement with the Malteser organization in Slovenia</li> <li>- also underway is a plan to collaborate with the Serbian Red Cross concentrating the support on the areas along the border referred to as no man's land</li> </ul>
